Ash Wednesday is February 22 this year, and of course that is the beginning of Lent, the 6-week period leading up to Easter. We'll have an Ash Wednesday service on that Wednesday evening, including the imposition of ashes.

So I've been trying to figure out what to do in the service for the Lenten season. Over the years and here and there I've sometimes done a Lenten sermon "series". My first book, The High Places, was based on one series. In other years I've focused on the Lord's Prayer, parables of Jesus, and so forth, but I haven't done this in a long time.

This year I think I'll try again. I've spent some time recently looking at "spirituality," meaning those personal acts and thoughts that bring us closer to God, like prayer, thanksgiving, repentance, and others, and I'd like to address one of those each Sunday. It is as much a personal discipline for me as for the congregation, and I hope you'll be present during this holy season.

We treat Lent a lot like New Year's Day. We look for things to "give up," to change our lives. In the various gyms and fitness centers where I've been a member, we call the early-January people "revolutionaries", and they rarely last very long. If you're planning some personal behavior change for Lent, I urge you to stick it out. Six weeks usually sets anew pattern.

## Seasons of Change

By the Worship Committee



**Liturgist (lit-ur-gist):** *one who adheres to, compiles, or leads a liturgy (a rite or rites prescribed for public worship). The first known use of the word Liturgist was in 1649.*

Thank you to all our congregation members who have helped with Worship by serving as a liturgist. This is an important part of the ministry of the church, but also a rewarding way to contribute to Dublin Presbyterian Church.

When serving as Liturgist, you are helping people to worship through the reading of scripture, through prayers, and through calling the people to participate in Worship. Therefore, words are very important in this ministry. In a typical Sunday morning worship service, the liturgist will:

- Lead the congregation in the Call to Worship;
- Lead the Prayer for Understanding (before the first reading);
- Read the first Scripture reading, including any introductory comments about the text.

While the Liturgist's traditional responsibilities are listed above, they may change from time to time and the pastor will let you know if there is a change. As you prepare to serve as Liturgist, please remember to speak slowly and clearly so everyone can hear you. Also, you are encouraged to read with feeling and emotion. The Bible is our storybook and your words can help worshippers enter more fully into that story. Some other tips for preparation include:

- The Pastor office staff will provide you with a copy of the bulletin (or text of the prayers and reading) a few days before the service. (Via E-Mail).
- Print off your prayers and bring them with you so you have any notes you may have made.
- Plan to arrive at church at least 15 minutes before the service begins. When you arrive, check in with the pastor, adjust the lectern microphone if necessary, make sure you have a bulletin and anything else you might need for worship.
- A few minutes before worship, meet the pastor at the Sanctuary doors. You both will follow the Acolyte into the Sanctuary to begin the service. Unless you have been requested to assist with announcements, you will take your seat near the lectern while the pastor makes the announcements.
- Follow the bulletin for your parts of the service. Unless otherwise instructed, you will speak from the lectern.
- After you perform the first reading, you may rejoin the congregation by taking a seat in the pews.

Acting as a Liturgist is a spiritually rewarding way to serve at Dublin Presbyterian Church and your service is greatly appreciated. 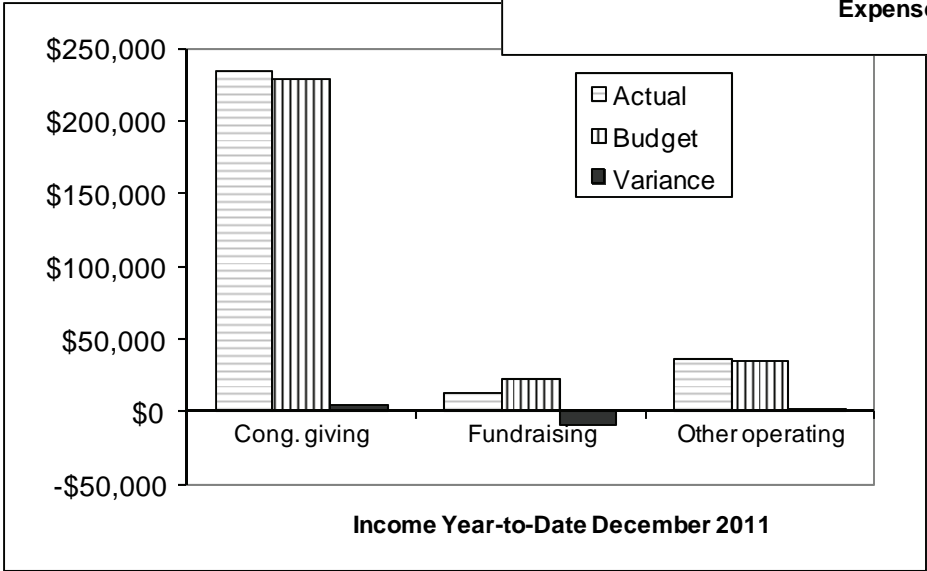
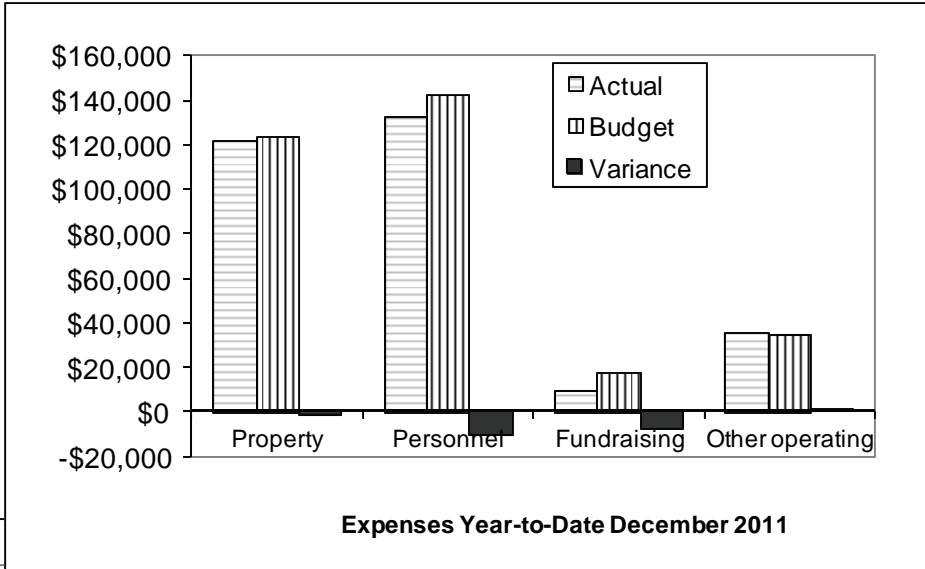

## Stewardship Report

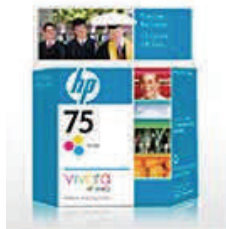
The 2012 Stewardship Campaign is off to a great start! As of December 11, 2011, we have received financial commitments of \$171,936.00.

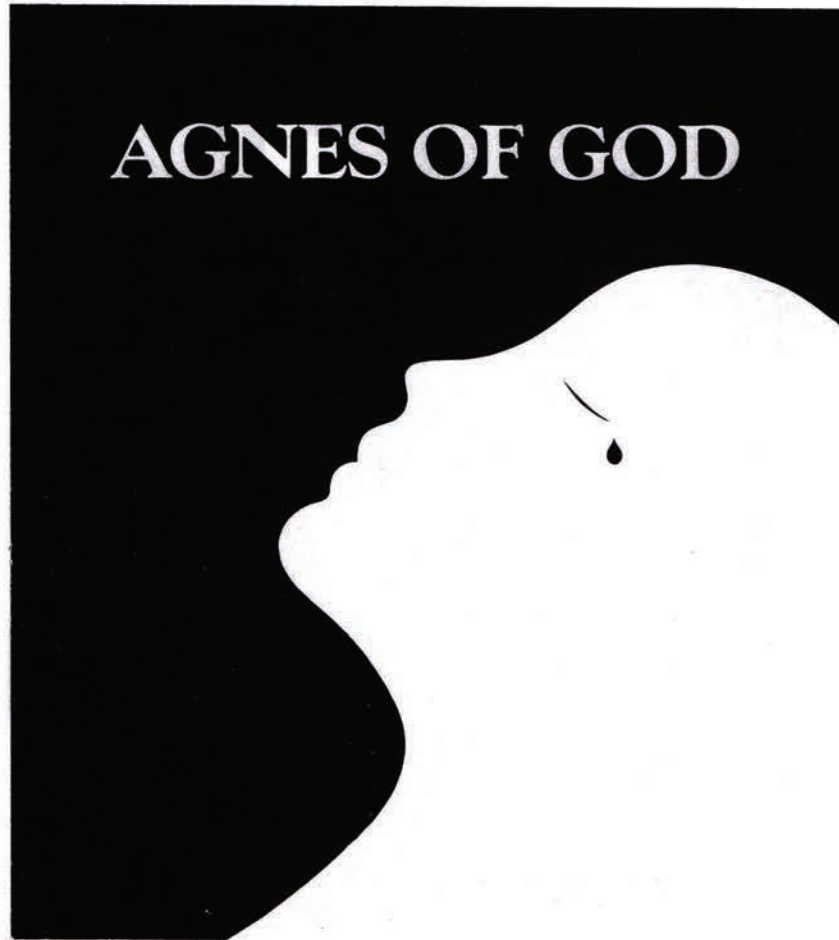
