## Seasons of Change and Leadership Change

Seasons are a visible reminder of change. Fall turning to Winter and Winter turning to Spring bring dramatic changes in temperature and weather that are kind of hard to miss. Likewise, for most people, New Years Eve celebrations make the change from one calendar year to the next equally hard to miss. But less noticeable are some of the changes that occur when a season ends on a different schedule from the calendar year.

One such example is the Liturgical year, which actually begins with the season of Advent. The Church New Year begins on the Sunday that falls nearest Nov. 30, which this year was on Nov. 27. While that Sunday begins advent, it can spring up on most people... "Surprise it's a new year"! While some activities like the Communion schedule and annual themes for our Worship services start and end in November, many other activities follow the calendar year. One example of this is the Installation and Ordination of New Elders and Deacons, whose terms of service begin in January. But who are Elders and Deacons and what do they do?

Elders and Deacons are people elected from the church congregation and ordained for this service. In our church, a nominating committee is appointed by the Session and approved by the congregation. This committee identifies and nominates candidates who will become Elders and Deacons, with candidates approved by the congregation at a congregational meeting. Once ordained (in a service by the laying on of hands) these people serve for a fixed terms (generally three years), although they retain their ordination for life.

**Elders** make decisions regarding the administration and governance of the church. Generally there are twelve elders that form a ruling committee called the Session, which is moderated by the pastor. All elders have an equal vote in the session, and typically one or more elders will lead the various committees that support the administrative work of the church. Committees include, but are not limited to: Christian Education, Membership, Mission, Stewardship and Worship.

**Deacons** generally administer to the welfare of the congregation. However, it is the duty of deacons to minister to those who are in need, especially to the sick and to any who may be in distress both within and beyond the community of faith. Their function as set forth in Scripture is one of sympathy, witness, and service after the example of Jesus Christ.

Elders and Deacons may also assume other duties as may be delegated to them from time to time by the session or pastor, such as leading the people in worship through prayers, reading the Scriptures, presenting the gifts of the people and assisting with the Lord's Supper.

While the entire congregation has these similar responsibilities, the Elders and Deacons contribute a substantial amount of time and energy in the service of the Church. Please keep all of our (past and current) Elders and Deacons in your prayers and during January, please make an opportunity to thank our retiring leaders for their service.

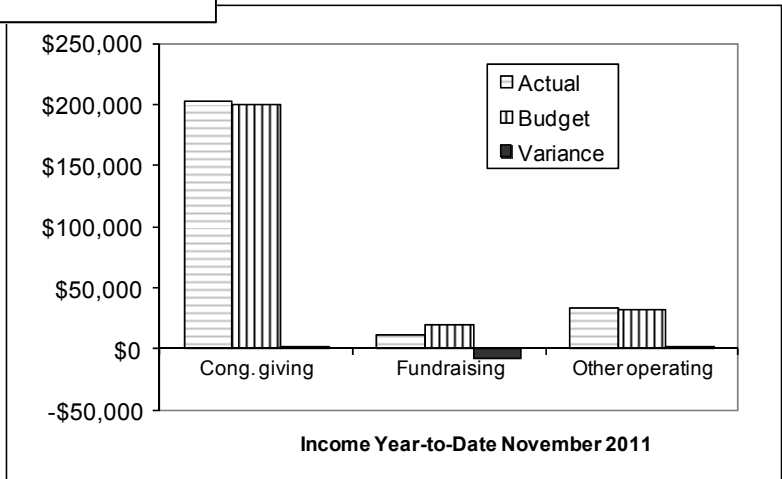
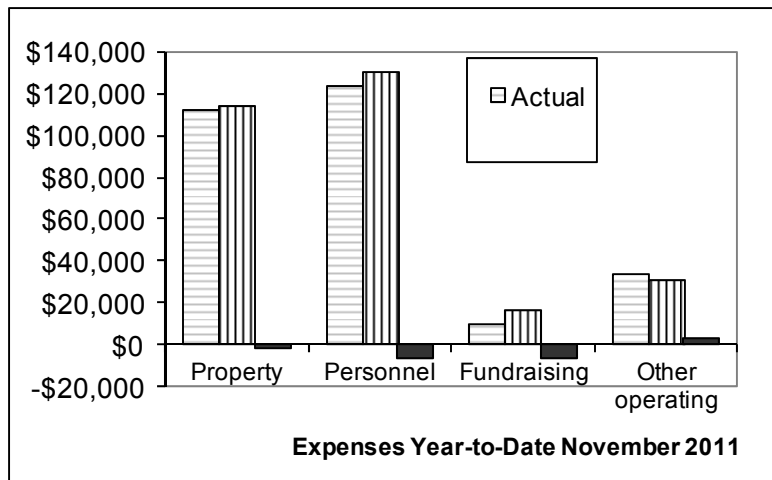

## Stewardship Report

The 2012 Stewardship Campaign is off to a great start! As of December 11, 2011, we have received financial commitments of \$171,936.00.

Unfortunately, this still leaves us short of our goal of \$238,000.00. We need to raise \$66,064.00 more to meet our goal and to maintain DPC's current programs.

A committee appointed by the Session to lead us in this task is Caroline Buchanan, Brent Davis, Rich Ferguson, Joanne Goza, Ralph LeVan, Jennifer McCann, and Doug Spaulding, with Phil Hazelton as an ex-officio member. This is NOT the pastoral search committee, which will be elected by the congregation when the self-study is completed and approved by presbytery.

## New Grand Piano

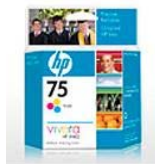
